The event today is filled with great promise, and on behalf of the organising group, can I thank you for coming and may you be blessed and encouraged by all you will see, and by those you will meet.





**THE SHOES BROTHERS**



**First Aid**

 Are you in need of a listening ear? Would you like to speak in confidence with a friendly Minister? A ministry team are available in their very own marquee throughout the afternoon, near the Ross Fountain.

 There are a variety of food and drink outlets within the Gardens, and also within St Cuthbert's Church.

**Accessibility**  
 Level access to Princes Street Gardens is available via the entrance on Kings Stables Road. Flat, paved roadways are available throughout the Gardens and all marquees are adjacent to roadways. Stage A - The Ross Bandstand has free seating, and level access. Stage B - St Cuthbert's Church has appropriate access, and a lift to higher levels. The closing worship service will be Signed for the deaf.

 It is the responsibility of the carers, parents or guardians of children and vulnerable adults to ensure their safety and wellbeing within Princes Street Gardens. It was Peter "the Rock" who wrote "Come as living stones, and let your selves be used in building the spiritual temple"

Congregations will be showing us how they build community in every corner of Scotland - and beyond. Sister churches will be in amongst the Kirk stands just as they are throughout the country. And these people, the Church, are to come together as community to worship God.
