Col John Cameron was killed in the Waterloo campaign, in the Battle at Quatre Bras, on June 16th 1815. An obelisk with a quotation by Sir Walter Scott marks his grave.

Text clean and sound. Litho Ills: Portrait, Fassiefern and the Obelisk.
Signed presentation inscription from Sir Duncan Cameron to Col Fleming on frt e-p.
MS Letter with seal, to his father about his death, from Mr Proctor, dated 30th June 1815.
